

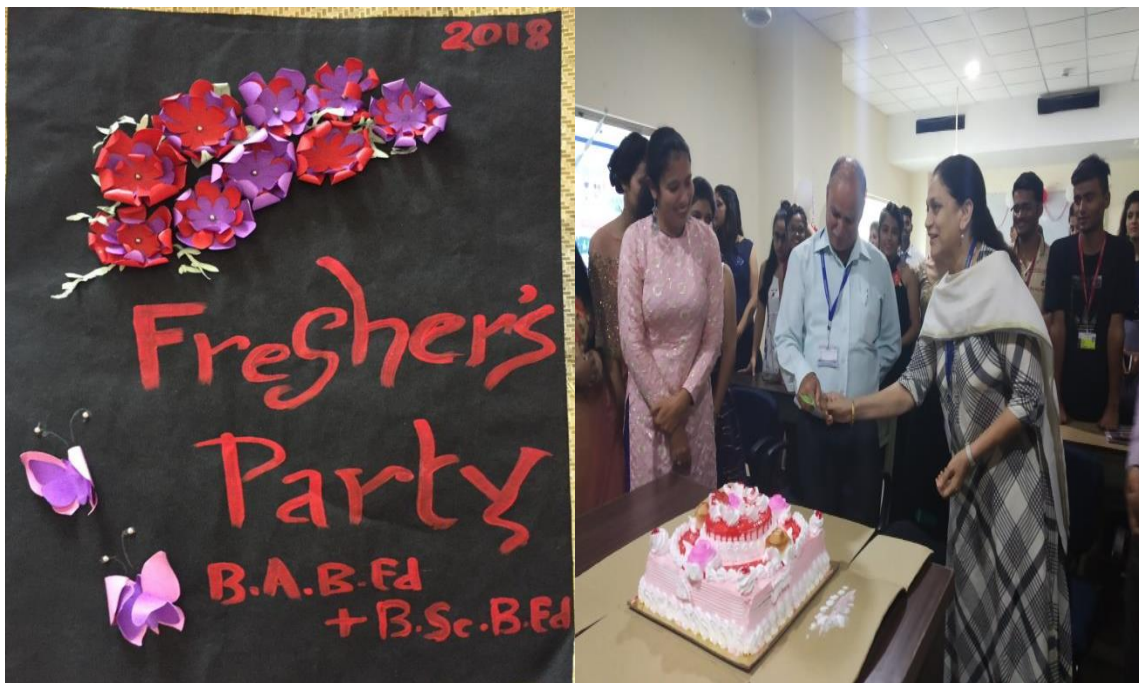

Visit to Jang-e-Azadi Memorial

One day educational trip to Jang-e-Azadi, Kartarpur, with an objective to provide students' knowledge about sacrifices made by Punjabi community during their struggle for freedom was organized by Department of Education on 11th September, 2018. It is a memorial and museum built in memory of contribution and sacrifices made by the Punjabi community in Indian Independence movement. It is built over an area of 25 acres. It has six museums which show different phases of struggle for freedom. Three films related to rich heritage and struggle for freedom were shown to the students and in the night laser light shows portraying the struggle of Punjabis for freedom was shown to the students.
