




The members discussed and deliberated on the various curricula being offered by various Universities viz-a-viz the requirements / needs of the present society.


Following points emerged out of the meeting:

2. The total credits per semester should not be less than 16.
3. A course of Research Methodology must be offered as this course is very important from research view point.
4. The experts discussed in detail the semester wise requirement of courses and their syllabi to be incorporated in curriculum.
5. Accordingly, a detailed Scheme & Syllabus shall be prepared and shared with the members in due course.
