Subject Expert's Suggestions:

1. The board suggested that practical assignments should be given weightage in evaluation of commerce and management students. Some marks for class participation and attendance may also be considered.
2. More courses should be run in workshop mode and outside-the-classroom learning should be emphasized.
3. Both Prof. Chadha and Prof. Batra felt that the department needs to schedule frequent interactive sessions with experts as this helps the students to build a wider perspective.
4. Further, both Prof. Chadha and Prof. Batra while appreciating the faculty strength suggested that the Department should consider starting Ph.D. programme from the next academic session, following UGC norms on the subject. Such program should be initiated in those specializations where the department has recognized expertise/faculty.

Suggestions regarding specific topics in different syllabi given by the external experts were well appreciated and the Board resolved to bring its schemes and syllabi in accordance with the suggestions.
